- 1 Amending Title 18 (Crimes and Offenses) of the Pennsylvania 2 Consolidated Statutes, in inchoate crimes, further providing
- for the offense of possessing instruments of crime.
- 4 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 5 hereby enacts as follows:
- 6 Section 1. Section 907(d) of Title 18 of the Pennsylvania
- 7 Consolidated Statutes is amended by adding a definition and the
- 8 section is amended by adding a subsection to read:
- 9 § 907. Possessing instruments of crime.
- 10 * * *
- 11 (c.1) Unlawful false or secret compartment.--A person
- 12 commits a misdemeanor of the first degree if he possesses a
- 13 <u>false or secret compartment in a motor vehicle with the intent</u>
- 14 to employ the false or secret compartment criminally.
- 15 (d) Definitions.--As used in this section, the following
- 16 words and phrases shall have the meanings given to them in this
- 17 subsection:
- 18 * * *

- 1 <u>"False or secret compartment." Any enclosure integrated into</u>
- 2 <u>a motor vehicle that is a modification of the motor vehicle as</u>
- 3 <u>built by the manufacturer. The term does not include a</u>
- 4 <u>compartment used or possessed solely for the purpose of securing</u>
- 5 <u>valuables</u>, <u>electronics</u>, <u>firearms or other personal property that</u>
- 6 <u>is lawfully possessed.</u>

- 8 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
