AN ACT

Amending the act of May 3, 1933 (P.L.242, No.86), entitled "An act to promote the public health and safety by providing for 2 examination, licensing and granting of permits for those who 3 desire to engage in the profession of cosmetology; defining cosmetology, and regulating cosmetology salons, schools, 5 students, apprentices, teachers, managers, manicurists and 6 cosmetologists; conferring powers and duties upon the Commissioner of Professional and Occupational Affairs of the 7 8 Department of State; providing for appeals to certain courts 9 by applicants and licensees; and providing penalties," 10 further providing for eligibility requirements for 11 examination, for limited licenses and for duration and 12 renewal of licenses. 13 14 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 15 hereby enacts as follows: 16 Section 1. Sections 4, 5 and 19 of the act of May 3, 1933 (P.L.242, No.86), referred to as the Cosmetology Law, are 17 18 amended to read: 19 Section 4. Eligibility Requirements for Examination .-- (a) No person shall be permitted by the board to receive a license 20 21 as a cosmetologist unless such person (1) shall be at least 22 sixteen years of age and of good moral character at the time of 23 making application, and (2) shall have (i) completed a tenth

- 1 grade education or the equivalent thereof, or in lieu of such
- 2 education or the equivalent thereof shall have received training
- 3 from or under the auspices of the Bureau of Rehabilitation in
- 4 the Department of Labor and Industry, and (ii) completed one
- 5 hour of domestic violence and sexual assault awareness training
- 6 <u>as approved by the board, and</u> (3) shall have either (i)
- 7 completed not less than one thousand two hundred fifty hours as
- 8 a student in a duly registered school of cosmetology as
- 9 hereinafter provided in this act, or (ii) shall have been
- 10 registered and served as an apprentice at least two thousand
- 11 hours in a licensed cosmetology salon as hereinafter provided in
- 12 this act. The application shall be accompanied by a notarized
- 13 statement from either the licensed cosmetology school the
- 14 applicant attended or the licensed cosmetology teacher in the
- 15 licensed cosmetology salon where the applicant studied and
- 16 trained, stating that the applicant has completed the study and
- 17 training period required under this act.
- 18 (b) An applicant wishing to obtain licensure in the practice
- 19 of cosmetology may be permitted to apply to take the written
- 20 examination upon completion of at least nine hundred hours of
- 21 instruction in a duly licensed school of cosmetology. The
- 22 examination shall include both theoretical and procedural skill
- 23 questions as prescribed by the board. Any applicant may apply
- 24 and is eligible for licensure upon (1) passing the written
- 25 examination, (2) completion of the required one thousand two
- 26 hundred fifty hours of instruction, [and] (3) certification by a
- 27 duly licensed school of satisfactory completion of all program
- 28 requirements, and (4) completion of one hour of domestic
- 29 violence and sexual assault awareness training as approved by
- 30 the board.

- 1 (c) No person shall be permitted to receive a license to
- 2 teach cosmetology or natural hair braiding, nail technology or
- 3 esthetics unless such person shall have a license to practice
- 4 cosmetology or a limited license, be at least eighteen years of
- 5 age, shall have completed a twelfth grade education or the
- 6 equivalent thereof, have completed one hour of domestic violence
- 7 and sexual assault awareness training as approved by the board
- 8 and have had five hundred hours of specialized training as set
- 9 forth in section 6 of this act which hours shall be in addition
- 10 to the hours necessary to qualify for a license to practice
- 11 cosmetology or a limited license.
- 12 (d) An applicant for a license to teach cosmetology, natural
- 13 hair braiding, nail technology or esthetics shall be permitted
- 14 to take a written examination upon completion of at least four
- 15 hundred hours of the specialized training required. The
- 16 examination shall include both theoretical and procedural skill
- 17 questions as prescribed by the board. Any applicant may apply
- 18 and is eligible for licensure upon (1) passing the written
- 19 examination, (2) completion of the required five hundred hours
- 20 of instruction, [and] (3) certification by a duly licensed
- 21 school of satisfactory completion of all program requirements,
- 22 and (4) completion of one hour of domestic violence and sexual
- 23 assault awareness training as approved by the board.
- 24 Section 5. Limited Licenses. -- (a) An applicant for a
- 25 limited license shall be at least sixteen years of age, be of
- 26 good moral character, have completed a tenth grade education or
- 27 the equivalent thereof and pay the applicable fee to the board.
- 28 (b) The board shall issue the following limited licenses to
- 29 qualified applicants:
- 30 (1) Esthetician license, which shall authorize the holder to

- 1 engage in the practice of esthetics only. An applicant for an
- 2 esthetician license shall have completed three hundred hours of
- 3 instruction in esthetics in a licensed school of cosmetology and
- 4 passed an examination limited to that practice. Licensed
- 5 estheticians may operate a salon limited to that license. An
- 6 applicant may be permitted to apply to take a written
- 7 examination upon completion of at least two hundred fifty hours
- 8 of instruction in esthetics in a licensed school of cosmetology.
- 9 The examination shall include both theoretical and procedural
- 10 skill questions as prescribed by the board. Any applicant may
- 11 apply and is eligible for licensure upon (i) passing the written
- 12 examination, (ii) completion of the required three hundred hours
- 13 of instruction, [and] (iii) certification by a duly licensed
- 14 school of satisfactory completion of all program requirements,
- 15 and (iv) completion of one hour of domestic violence and sexual
- 16 assault awareness training as approved by the board.
- 17 (2) Nail technician license, which shall authorize the
- 18 holder to engage in the practice of nail technology only. An
- 19 applicant for a nail technician license shall have completed two
- 20 hundred hours of instruction in nail technology in a licensed
- 21 school of cosmetology and passed an examination limited to that
- 22 practice. Licensed nail technicians may operate a salon limited
- 23 to that license. An applicant may be permitted to take a written
- 24 examination upon completion of at least one hundred fifty hours
- 25 of instruction in nail technology in a licensed school of
- 26 cosmetology. The examination shall include both theoretical and
- 27 procedural skill questions as prescribed by the board. Any
- 28 applicant may apply and is eligible for licensure upon (i)
- 29 passing the written examination, (ii) completion of the required
- 30 two hundred hours of instruction, [and] (iii) certification by a

- 1 duly licensed school of satisfactory completion of all program
- 2 requirements, and (iv) completion of one hour of domestic
- 3 violence and sexual assault awareness training as approved by
- 4 the board.
- 5 (3) (i) Natural hair braiding license, which shall
- 6 authorize the holder to engage in the practice of natural hair
- 7 braiding only. An applicant for a natural hair braiding license
- 8 shall have completed three hundred hours of board-approved
- 9 subjects relating to sanitation, scalp care, anatomy and natural
- 10 hair braiding in a cosmetology school and passed an examination
- 11 limited to that practice. Licensed natural hair braiders may
- 12 operate a salon limited to that license. An applicant may be
- 13 permitted to take a written examination upon completion of at
- 14 least two hundred fifty hours of instruction in natural hair
- 15 braiding in a licensed school of cosmetology. The examination
- 16 shall include both theoretical and procedural skill questions as
- 17 prescribed by the board. Any applicant may apply and is eligible
- 18 for licensure upon (A) passing the written examination, (B)
- 19 completion of the required three hundred hours of board-approved
- 20 subjects, [and] (C) certification by a duly licensed school of
- 21 satisfactory completion of all program requirements, and (D)
- 22 <u>completion of one hour of domestic violence and sexual assault</u>
- 23 <u>awareness training as approved by the board</u>.
- 24 (ii) The requirements of paragraph (3)(i) shall not apply
- 25 and a license to practice natural hair braiding shall be issued
- 26 to an applicant who:
- 27 (A) has submitted an application, along with the required
- 28 fee, within one year of the board's promulgation of final
- 29 regulations required under this section; and
- 30 (B) can demonstrate proof of practice of natural hair

- 1 braiding for three consecutive years immediately prior to the
- 2 date of application for licensure. Proof of practice shall
- 3 require tax records of employment and an affidavit from the
- 4 applicant and the applicant's immediate supervisor where
- 5 applicable. The board shall accept the information provided
- 6 without penalty to the applicant for failure to comply with
- 7 licensing provisions prior to the effective date of this
- 8 subsection.
- 9 (c) Within two years of the initial issuance of a license
- 10 under subsection (b)(3)(ii), the licensee shall provide the
- 11 board with proof that the licensee completed one hundred fifty
- 12 hours of education from a school of cosmetology and one hour of
- 13 domestic violence and sexual assault awareness training as
- 14 approved by the board as a condition of renewal of the license.
- 15 The courses shall include, at a minimum, scalp care, hygiene and
- 16 occupational safety.
- 17 Section 19. Duration and Renewal of Licenses. -- (a) With the
- 18 period ending January 31, 1986, the Bureau of Professional and
- 19 Occupational Affairs shall designate approximately one-half of
- 20 the renewals to expire in twelve months and the remainder of the
- 21 renewals to expire in twenty-four months. Thereafter, licenses
- 22 shall expire on the thirty-first day of January of each
- 23 succeeding biennium unless renewed for the next biennium.
- 24 Licenses may be renewed by application made prior to the thirty-
- 25 first day of January of each succeeding biennium, and the
- 26 payment of the renewal fees provided in this act.
- 27 (b) An individual holding a license to practice cosmetology
- 28 or an individual holding a limited license who is not engaged in
- 29 practice shall request the board, in writing, to place his
- 30 license in escrow and thus protect his right to obtain a license

- 1 at any such time within a five-year period if he desires to
- 2 again become engaged in the practice of cosmetology or the
- 3 practice of nail technology, natural hair braiding or esthetics.
- 4 (c) Any person who fails to renew his license or has
- 5 escrowed his license for a period of five years without renewing
- 6 his license shall, prior to receiving a license, submit to and
- 7 pass an examination appropriate to the license being sought.
- 8 (d) Any person who fails to meet the one hour of domestic
- 9 <u>violence and sexual assault awareness training requirement</u>
- 10 provided in this act shall not be eligible for renewal until the
- 11 training has been completed. Proof of completion of the training
- 12 shall be submitted with the appropriate application to the board
- 13 at the time of renewal for any person who has not completed the
- 14 training requirement prior to the issuance of their initial
- 15 license.
- 16 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 180 days.
